 Plan a set of commands to achieve a specific outcome. Predict the outcome of an algorithm using logical reasoning. Control devices through a series of commands (algorithm). Write, test and debug simple programs. Understand the benefits of using technology beyond school. 	We will identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats, including microhabitats describing how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals, using the idea of a simple food chain, and identify and name different sources of food. In geography, we will be learning all about Explorers. We will be considering what an Explorer is, looking at where Explorers have travelled and when. Finally, we will be learning about some famous explorers and considering how exploration has changed over time and what legacies remain. In DT, we will be looking at what makes a balanced diet and tasting food to find our preferred combinations. We will design, make and eat a healthy wrap and then evaluate it. In PSHE and as part of our Crew sessions, we will be thinking about looking after each other and how we can respect each other and the environment. In music, we will be exploring Zootime (a reggae song for children) and other reggae songs. In RE, we will be learning how and why people pray. We will introduce the children to how Christians and Muslim pray. The children will develop an understanding of the importance of prayer to those who belong to that religion. In the summer term, we have arranged a trip to visit a mosque: further details to follow. <u>Reading</u>	Please record any work you have been doing at home: we will regularly check your child's book to see how they have been getting on. Please return your child's book during the last week of the half term so we can mark their work and provide feedback. We are very keen to promote a lifelong love of reading and therefore have a dedicated library time every Tuesday. Please can we ask that your child returns their book every Tuesday so they can choose a new book. Books cannot be changed if they are not returned.

Children have three Reading Practice sessions per week at school. In addition, please could you read with your child at home as often as possible, ideally daily, and write a short note in your child's reading record when having done so.

The book changing days are the same for both classes and align to Crews: Monday/Tuesday: Innovators Wednesday: Pioneers Thursday: Motivators Friday: Explorers

Books are only changed on these days so please ensure your child reads their book twice and if completed, please feel free to read a book at home of your child's choice.
