Computing

In our geography sessions we will explore volcanoes, one of the most fascinating phenomena in the world. We will discover where in the world volcanoes are found before looking at how and why volcanoes erupt. We will explore the positive and negative impact of eruptions on the environment and why people would choose to live near a volcano. We will also find out about the famous eruption of Mount Vesuvius in AD 79 and its impact on the surrounding area.
