Safer Internet Day - Tuesday 9th February

An internet we trust - exploring reliability in the online world



Next week, we observe Safer Internet Day, which this year focuses on how we can decide what to trust online, supporting children to question, challenge and change the online world for the better. It will explore how influence, persuasion and manipulation can impact children's decisions, opinions and what they share online.

The day will also look at the emotional impact navigating a misleading online world can have on young people and why it is important to create a supportive, critical and questioning culture online that encourages debate and discussion. This will help children to develop the skills to support one another, and the strategies to spot and speak out against harmful and misleading content online.

No Child Cold Campaign

As a result of the latest lockdown, 75,000 children in our district are currently at home all day, every day at a time of year when temperatures are very low. Many families across the district are struggling to afford to heat their homes for this extra time.

No Child Cold is a campaign to raise money to provide direct help to these families. It has been set up by Bradford partners to make sure that no child in the Bradford District is left in the cold this winter as a result of lockdown. Those partners include Citizens Advice, Bradford Council, along with faith and community organisations and businesses in our district.

As our districts' children sit down at home to access remote learning, we want to make sure no child is unable to learn, because they are simply too cold.
