We will be sharing our class novel for the half term, <i>The Twits</i> , and creating a character profile of Mr Twit. We will be learning all about the famous explorer Amelia Earhart and writing biographies of her life. We will write narrative stories based on a Christmas theme and create acrostic poems. In phonics we will be starting our 'Bridge to spelling' unit where we will be learning the rules of spelling and why we use them. We are very keen to promote a lifelong love of reading and therefore have a dedicated library time every Tuesday. Please can we ask that your child returns their book every Tuesday so they can choose a new book. Books cannot be changed if they are not returned.	We will be continuing our learning on addition and subtraction, thinking about how addition of 2 numbers can be done in any order (commutative) and looking at the inverse relationship between addition and subtraction. We will then move on to learning about shape where we will name and describe the properties of 2D and 3D shapes and compare and sort them. We will be continuing to explore e-safety and ensuring we all know how to use technology correctly and carefully. We will be practising logging onto the chromebooks, using our personalised log in details and considering why passwords need to be private. We will consider how people use technology in different environments and appreciate how the content of information may belong to other people.	In science we will be discussing the importance of exercise, a healthy diet and hygiene. We will also Identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for particular uses. In geography we will be developing our knowledge of our local community, the United Kingdom and the wider world; whilst working on our map skills. In DT, we will continue to design and make our own wheeled vehicles. We will develop our sewing skills to make a festive decoration. In PSHE and as part of our Crew sessions, we will be valuing our differences and revisiting our British values. In music, we'll be listening, appraising and performing a festive song, with rapping. In RE, we will be continuing to explore how new life is welcomed in both Christian and Muslim families.	Please can homework books be returned to school by <b>Wednesday</b> <b>8th November</b> . Please ensure you read with your child at home as often as possible, ideally daily, and write a short note in your child's reading record when having done so.
