English	Maths	Science
In English this half term we will be creating some fiction stories based on the short film - The Present - by Jacob Frey. We will then move on to producing some balanced arguments in which the children will be able to explore the evidence for whether the Victorians were vile or virtuous.	In maths we will be covering the themes of position and direction, decimals (using the four operations), negative numbers, converting units and volume.  Please continue to log on to TT Rockstars at home or any other activities that strengthen your child's mathematical knowledge.	This half term we will be continuing our study of reproduction in plants and will progress to a unit on reversible and irreversible changes. The children will be working scientifically to put their predictions to the test, then making conclusions using the evidence they collect.

This half term we will be continuing with the Victorians; this takes on a local history focus, examining Titus Salt and his Saltaire legacy.	In computing, we create our own radio adverts and persuasive films. We will design 3D models and deliver presentations using speaker notes and presenter view. The children will also collaborate online with their peers to create animated documents.	Design Technology In DT, we will be designing and making our own Victorian inspired stuffed toys. Children will learn how to use the blanket stitch.
