This half term the children will be completing some non-fiction work on creating a persuasive speech, based on the speeches of Greta Thunberg and focussing on climate change, endangered species and aspects of the environment. They will create their own poetry anthology, study the life of Malala Yousafzai and carry out their own research. In guided reading each week, the children will study extracts from different texts - fiction, non-fiction and poetry. They will begin with an extract from Greta Thunberg's speeches and study poetry by Maya Angelou and Benjamin Zephaniah. Children will learn to: -recognise that light appears to travel in straight lines -use the idea that light travels in straight lines to explain that objects are seen because they give out or reflect light into the eye - explain that we see things because light travels from light sources to our eyes or from light sources to objects and then to our eyes -use the idea that light travels in straight lines to explain why shadows have the same shape as the objects that cast them.

The children will be learning about why certain parts of the world are more populated than others; exploring birth and death rates; discussing social, economic and environmental push and pull factors; learning about the population in Britain and its impacts.	In music, the children will be researching plastic pollution and then composing, rehearsing and recording a song in order to spread awareness. They will be learning how to create songs with verses and a chorus and how to communicate ideas, thoughts and feelings through musical demonstration.			In PSHE and SMSC, through Crew, children will be learning what makes a democratic society. They will investigate issues around tolerance and acceptance, as well as other responsibilities of living in the wider world.
