| In English the children will be exploring the Greek gods in order to write character descriptions and fact files. Additionally, they will be reading and retelling popular Greek myths The children will be continuing to read a variety of texts in guided reading and will be building on their skills and improving their prosody, as well as studying language and vocabulary. | There will be plenty of cross curricular maths including data recording and analysis of statistics. As well as this, children will be learning about pie-charts, shapes and the mean. They will then look at translation and reflection before the end of the term. We will be completing our work on ratio and proportion, fractions, decimals and percentages. Please encourage your children to finish their work on SATS Companion that will be set weekly. | | Children will be continuing to learn about variation and adaptation. They'll also examine the scientific evidence from plants and animals that has been gathered to support the theory of evolution. They will then be starting their new science topic, learning about light and shadows. |
| Humanities | PSHE | | Oracy |
| In history, the children will be learning about the rise and fall of the Ancient Greek civilisation, its achievements and follies, location in time and place, and how it compared with other ancient civilisations. 800 BC – 31 BC. | This half term the children will be learning about puberty and growing up. Most of these lessons are compulsory for everyone, although later in the term there will be a lesson on making babies, which is an additional sex education lesson and therefore not compulsory. If you wish your child to be exempt from this specific lesson, please keep an eye out for the google form which will be sent out over the coming weeks which will enable you to state your preferences. | | Year 6's big oracy question for this term is "What is the greatest thing the Greeks did for us?". At the end of the topic, the children will be debating which of the legacies the Ancient Greeks left behind has made the biggest impact on life today. We encourage the children to discuss this at home too, to get their ideas going! |
