Our priority is looking after your children's wellbeing and making school a safe and positive place to be. In the first few weeks of Year One we will get to know your children really well and find out where they are in their learning and adapt our provision accordingly to meet the needs of each child. If you have any concerns please feel free to speak to one of the Year One team.

We are so excited about our topic this half term *Home Sweet Home*. We will be looking at our school and the area in which we live, discussing the difference between city and country homes. We will be reading a selection of books including *The Three Little Pigs* and *Mouse House*. The children will be taking a short walk around Saltaire to find out more about Sir Titus Salt and his village. In maths we will start with looking at 3D and 2D shapes, we will then continue to learn to count, read and write numbers to 10.

Reading	Mondays/ Fridays
Your child will continue to bring home a reading book in Year One. We will be sending home your child's school reading book therefore it is important it is returned each day so your child can take part in group reading sessions at school. Your child will retain their Reading Record from Reception please note down when you have read with your child. If your child reads 5 times a week at home they will be given a gold sticker. In the coming weeks we will hold a Year One Phonics workshop (please see date above).	Please ensure your child attends school in a full PE kit, school colours (no football kits). Children are required to wear black trainers, which your child needs to be able to fasten themselves ( we recommend velcro). For your children's safety, long hair must be tied up and all jewellery removed.
<b>Tricky Words</b> Tricky words will continue from Reception, please continue to practise these words frequently. When you require a new set please hand them in to the member of staff at the door. If your child learnt to read all the Reception tricky words they will be started on the Year One sets. We do ask you continue to learn to write the Reception sets too.	



## Maths

You will receive a homework book on Friday 13th September that has a weekly Maths task. Please record any work you have been doing at home in your books. Please return your child's homework book in their book bag on a Thursday.

## Phonics

Phonics homework will be set every week for your child to practise the sounds they have been taught that week. Your child's Phonics homework does not need to be returned to school.

Text: The Three Little Pigs Mouse House - Oral storytelling - Story sequencing - Describing - Similarities and differences	We will be starting our learning journey with place value. Sorting, matching, and number composition to 10 and beyond. Children will then move on to addition and subtraction. Children will practise combining numbers to find a total, verbally share their number sentences and most will begin to write their number sentences.	This term we are going to be looking at different materials and their purposes. We will be investigating the most suitable materials to create houses.	
Humanities We will be looking at the area in which we live by starting with our school then our local area, looking at the different types of houses. We will then be looking at history and how we help to make history. We will be exploring what it was like in the past to live in Saltaire as a child.	Art/DT In DT we will be trying our hands at textiles looking at weaving and threading. We will be using different fabrics and materials. We will also be making our own model houses by learning how we can turn cardboard boxes inside out.	Computing We are going to have a great time with our Beebots. We will learn about what algorithms are and how we can programme instructions. We can then watch as they follow our instructionsor not! I wonder where they will end up?
