Please encourage your child to use pure sounds when sounding out words e.g. 'mmm' not 'muh'. We will continue to send Phonics homework on a Friday when new graphemes/phonemes have been taught.

Please send your reading books and reading records back to school each day in your child's bookbag. Children will read with an adult in school three times a week.

As we progress through Year One we will continue to learn 'tricky words'. Please work with your child at home to read and spell their 'tricky words'. Once they are able to read them please send them back to school and we will send you the next set.
