 We will be completing our learning about Data Handling then moving on to learn about Computer Science. In this unit, we will: Understand that real and virtual devices can be controlled by sequences of commands (algorithm). Plan a set of commands to achieve a specific outcome. Predict the outcome of an algorithm using logical reasoning. Control devices through a series of commands (algorithm). Write, test and debug simple programs. Understand the benefits of using technology beyond school. 	In science we will identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats, including microhabitats describing how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals, using the idea of a simple food chain, and identify and name different sources of food. In geography, we will be learning all about Explorers. We will be considering what an Explorer is, looking at where Explorers have travelled and when. Finally, we will be learning about some famous explorers and considering how exploration has changed over time and what legacies remain. In DT, we will be looking at what makes a balanced diet and tasting food to find our preferred combinations. We will design, make and eat a healthy wrap and then evaluate it.	You will receive your homework book on Friday 7th March that has maths and english tasks for the half term. Please record any work you have been doing at home: we will regularly check your child's book to see how they have been getting on.
