
Learning

Our topic this term is: 'Homes!'



Tricky Words- Now we are moving into a new term. Please can we ask you to practise the Tricky Words as often as you can. This includes revisiting sets they already know. Thanks in advance.

Class Trays - The staff will have a tray in the mornings for the children to put in any Tricky Words or Maths

Challenges you need changing. Please be aware some challenges may not be changed on the day they are handed in, we will try and get them back to you as soon as possible.

Reading Books - We are continuing to introduce new letter sounds and ask you to keep up the good work practising them at home and applying them when sharing their reading book or library books – the children are making fantastic progress!

Please ensure children bring their reading practice files into school everyday. This is so they can use their book during our reading practice sessions in school. If they don't bring in their book it makes practise reading more tricky for them as they will have to share books. Please have these ready each morning so these can be placed in the book files in the classroom.

Library books - These will be changed on **Fridays** so please make sure book bags are in school on this day as we cannot send a new book without the old one being returned.

Please remember to make a short comment in your child's reading journal once they have read their book or practised their tricky words. It all counts towards gaining their star reader sticker and lets us know how your child is progressing with reading at home.

Spare Clothes - Please send in spare clothes, including socks and underwear, for your child to keep on their peg in case they should need to get changed especially now as the weather gets colder and wetter. Please make sure everything is named.

Junk Modelling - Please save old boxes eg toothpaste, kitchen rolls, yoghurt pots, bottle tops or lids, etc and give them to your child's class teacher for small and large junk modelling.

Clothing - Please can you make sure that **all** items of clothing, coats, hats, scarfs, gloves etc are clearly named. Lost items can be found and returned so much easier when the name is clearly visible.

Wow Moments - These are an opportunity to share your children's achievements at home with your child's class teacher that we might otherwise not hear about. For example, if your child receives a swimming badge or learns to ride their bike, this could be shared with school. **Please add these pictures or written messages to Tapestry.**
